It is nighttime at sea. The great ship heaves violently from tortured waves in a powerful storm. Rain slashes the bow amid flashing lightning strikes and hits the glass of the wheelhouse as the captain struggles to stand erect. Suddenly he smiles at the sight of the lighthouse, whose bright lamp beckons him to safety and hope amid the chaos. That is an apt image for our world at discomfoting moments in history, either the world within us or the one outside us

You and I are not likely to experience a literal storm at sea, and that is a good thing. But it is quite probable that most of us will have to live through stormy weather at some point in our lives. How will we avoid shipwreck? How will we get through to the other side of the storm to enjoy calm seas and sunny skies again? The Gospels suggest the best way: by keeping sight of the Light of the nations, who is Christ Jesus, and following His guidance.

At Mass we should be conscious that Jesus is not only the Light but also the Lamb of God. He sacrificed Himself for us personally out of a love we could never equal. He offers us, "smooth sailing" in the next life on a tranquil sea if we will get onboard, prepared for whatever comes our way.

As for those who flee the battle in various forms of escape, or despair amid the fury of it, listen to a man named John A. Shedd, who wrote way back in 1928 these immortal words: "A ship in harbor is safe, but that is not what ships are built for."

Parish Registration

Formal membership with the parish in which you feel comfortable creates a sense of family. Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry’s school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized or who wish to register their child for religious education must be members of the parish.
