“Your cart is empty.” That’s a statement familiar to anyone who shops online these days. The website declaring it is only putting a thin veil over their real purpose, which is to get you and me to buy more. Against that pressure, however, is our will power. If it’s strong, we can say “no.” If it’s weak, well there goes our budget. The difference between the two decisions is prompted by something else, namely “wisdom.”

Jesus of course has incomparable wisdom in His “take” on the subject of possessions. We on the other hand, are not always wise. Like impulsive buying, we pressure ourselves too often in the matter of keeping up with the Jones’. We strive to surpass them with our own shiny pile of “stuff.” Does Our Lord want us to hate ourselves for this foolishness? No! If we start doing that, we’ll never have enough love left over for our neighbor as Jesus’ prime commandment tells us. We’ll never get to appreciate what Jesus loves in us either.

The cure for our fixation on possessions is that elusive item in our hearts, namely faith. A description of faith is “evidence of things not seen”. In our visual age, we tend to believe only what can be seen. So all that we accumulate could fool us into thinking they are the only reality. Faith says differently. In fact, it asks us to believe that when Jesus speaks of a kingdom not of this world He is speaking of what He knows.

When you catch yourself worrying too much about your buying power, it might be a good time to pray to God for a restored sense of balance.

Formal membership with the parish in which you feel comfortable creates a sense of family. Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a god-parent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized or who wish to register their child for religious education must be members of the parish.

New Air Conditioning System

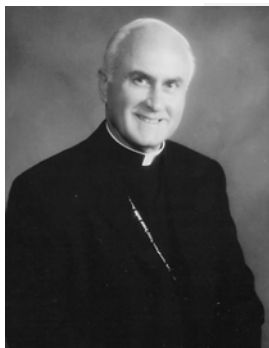
