Do you like it when change happens? Depending on the subject at hand, most people do not. Exceptions there may be of course, in matters like a return to good health or a healthy tax reimbursement check. But documentation exists that tells us that we mostly like things as they are, thank you very much.

Resistance to change intensifies as we age. The list of our complaints grows longer and our protests grow louder and more often. It is very difficult for some people to accept that change can be a good thing. Of course, we all must be wary of change for its own sake. The greatest "Challenger of the Status Quo" the world has ever known is no less than the Founder of our Church: Jesus Christ. His human nature was born and raised on our little

speck in the universe called "earth."

We have heard Jesus' message in one form or another from our earliest days. We step back in admiration of the beautiful hymn from Philippians for what it touts about the way Jesus never backed down from His heavenly Father's commission and the price He paid for so doing. But are we really able to align ourselves with His self-emptying? It can be done, you know. Even if the whole current of our society is flowing the opposite way, we can count on His grace to fortify our every effort to "swim" against it. That's what our Baptism, Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist are all about.

Something to be aware of that has been with us since the beginnings of Christianity but has a new impact on us is the presence of the so-called "social media." We no longer live in that "little house on the prairie." Wirelessly and without our asking for it comes a barrage of assaults on what Jesus taught 24/7/365. It pays to counteract it with as much connection to the Bible as we can. Pulling the plug or shutting our connection down even for a few hours a day will give us relief and strengthen our resistance. Throw a rosary in the mix and you have an unbeatable combination for making the right kind of change.

Religious Education...

Reminder: on the 3rd Sunday of each month all 3rd, 4th, 5th, 1st & 2nd year catch up and 1st & 2nd year RCIC children will be walked over to church at 9 AM by their respective Catechist to either participate in the Children's Choir (practice from 9AM to 9:30 AM and singing at the 10 AM Mass) or being taught Religion in the St. Benedict Chapel. The children will be dismissed from Church, not school and will remain with catechists until the parent/guardian picks them up. Please enter Church via the 28th St. glass door. Children will be sitting in pews by the Blessed Mother altar.

IMPORTANT: On the 3rd Sunday of each month, Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grades will be walked over to church for dismissal in the hope that you will attend Mass as a family. If you do not wish to have your child walked over to church at 9:45 AM, please meet them in front of St. Henry School no later than 9:40 AM. If you are not there by that time, go over to Church, enter 28th St. Side, and your child/children will be with catechists by the Blessed Mother Altar. Catechists will not leave your child alone.

Every 3rd Sunday of each month is Parish Family Time. On **Sunday, October 15th** we will be decorating pumpkins and refreshments will be served. A free will offering is asked.

Parish Registration

Formal membership with the parish in which you feel comfortable creates a sense of family. Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office — 201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized or who wish to register their child for religious education must be members of the parish.

Couples for Christ invites validly married Catholic couples and non-Catholic Christians for their upcoming **Christian Life Program** which will be held at St. Henry Parish. The Christian Life Program (or CLP) is an integrated course intended to lead the couple into a renewed understanding of God's call to them as Christians. It runs for 7 separate sessions, held once a week.
