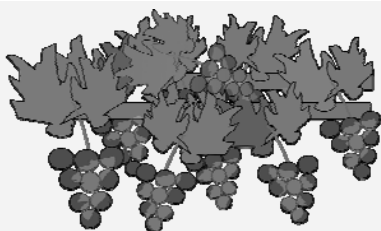

Or are we just going through the motions, absorbing the sun that shines and the rain that falls but not putting out the fine crop we did in years gone by?

Attaining the peace of God, which we all really want even if we don't say so, means pursuing "whatever is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely and gracious" and "keep on doing it." Doing it day by day is the key to success. Or as one writer put it: "Yard by yard, life is hard. Inch by inch, it's a cinch."

If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized or who wish to register their child for religious education must be members of the parish.
