Historians tell us that the first Fourth of July almost didn't happen. That is, as the date of our nation's declaration of independence from England. As much as we like Prince William and Kate, and many of us are enthralled by their children, I don't believe we'd prefer to sing "God save the Queen" over our national anthem at a ball game. That unhappy possibility was very real in 1776. Disagreements among the members of Congress often became as heated as the Philadelphia summer weather. Some members walked out of meetings. The famous Declaration underwent some serious rewriting. But finally John Hancock penned his famous signature on it, as did the other representatives. Suddenly thirteen colonies became a nation that remains the greatest.

The stories of great events often show the end coming out of rough or improbable beginnings. Here at Mass we celebrate the climax of the greatest story ever told. The difference between our national story and the New Testament is the direct involvement of the divine.

On this special weekend, when we celebrate the brave decision our Founding Fathers made, we are urged by the Holy Spirit, to stay faithful to that other society to which we belong, namely the Church Jesus founded.

Food Pantry Availability

As part of our partnership with St. Vincent de Paul Parish, St. Henry Bayonne parishioners who are in need of food may access the Food Pantry at St. Vincent's. The **Pantry will be open Thursdays, July 16th & 30th.** Pantry hours are **3—5 PM (closed in August)** and it is temporarily located in the basement of St. Vincent Church (entrance on 47th St., closest to Ave. C).

IMPORTANT: In order to receive food you must indicate that you are from St. Henry Parish and bring with you current picture I.D. and current proof of residence (utility bill indicating your address in Bayonne).

REMINDER: St. Henry Parish has a small food pantry, located in our Rectory Office, available 9 AM—3 PM weekdays. Closed Fridays during the Summer. Bring picture ID.

Parish Registration

If you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not a registered member of St. Henry Parish.

You are not automatically a registered member because you were married here, were brought up here or went to school here. Membership is by formal registration only. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and complete a registration card.

Remember, membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation.
