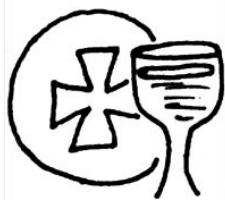
To Become Catholic or Complete the Sacraments

We didn't foster the civil strife or the climate factors that might have triggered it. Yet we feel this strong tug of guilt as if we did. It may stem from our belief that no one who lives on this green earth of ours, especially the children, should have to face starvation.

On the other hand, we also experience a touch of healthy pride when we see quite different pictures of our military distributing planeloads of American grown food to such victims.

Aid workers from our own and many other countries who also chip in to help underscores the truth we really are united with one another just by being human. As in other aspects of life, the good often balances out the bad.

For our part as believing Catholics, we will either have to accept such things like this becoming more and more "par for the course" or get up the courage to fight back in peaceful protest against them. That brings up the question of where we will get the energy to do so. Well, energy comes from food, and we have the greatest food source right in the nearest tabernacle or on the nearest altar at Mass. Since Jesus came, spiritual hunger should be a thing of the past, at least for those who believe Him. Do you get the picture?
