We have to remember invisible realities in this visual age, especially when we know about computerized trickery that fools our eyes watching movies or playing video games. There is an unseen world beyond our senses more real than we think. We need to remember because, combined with the familiarity that develops over the years, we can become blase about the Most Holy Eucharist, the Mass. When we see the tender awe in the eyes of the First Communion classes in our parish, their sense of wonder at full power, it is a gift and a remedy for any adult indifference we might have on a Sunday morning.

Summer is a good time to slow down the rush that dictates the pace of our days. We have an annual time to re-appreciate what the Lord has given us. No less than Himself, with all that means. We remember what Jesus said that day and what His Catholic Church echoes, and we are glad all over again.
