People today often talk about being spiritual, but not really religious. That sounds like someone saying I am artistic, but not really an artist. Spirituality is not content free, but builds upon your religious beliefs. These include, but are not limited to, our understanding of God, of ourselves, and what our faith requires of us in terms of behavior, values, and practices. Some people mistakenly believe that spirituality is about feeling better, being more prosperous, and seeking a better way of life for them and their family. Many of the newer televangelists preach this brand of faith—the gospel of prosperity and a feel-good theology.

True spirituality is following the Gospel of Jesus. It seeks the truth of redemption, forgiveness, and reconciliation. Spirituality and religion form and inform the whole person—mind, body and spirit. They are the foundation of our morality, our sense of purpose, and the meaning of our life. Spirituality leads us to Christ and to his body, the church. The specific thing we need to do is ask the Lord to form us in his image and likeness, as we receive the sacraments and draw closer to him through the community of faith. We judge our spiritual lives by the measure of Jesus and his Gospel. Authentic faith never fails that test.

Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

As we begin a new year, I'd like to share with you important information:

- ◆ Emails were sent to the parents/guardians of children who will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation on January 29th at 11AM in St. Henry Church. If you have not received that information, please do not hesitate to contact me directly at 908-612-6674 or leave a message on the Religious Education voicemail, 201-339-0319 and someone will return your call.
- ◆ Emails were sent to the parents/guardians whose children will be receiving First Eucharist, including All Saints children.
- ◆ Please be aware – if your family does not belong to St. Henry Parish, your child must receive the Sacrament of First Eucharist at the parish where you are registered. If you have any questions, please call me or leave a message on the Religious Education voicemail.
- ◆ Emails were sent to all parents/guardians of RCIC 2nd year children who will be receiving the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 16th. If you have questions, see above for contact information.
- ◆ Emails were sent to all parents/guardians of 9th grade Confirmation candidates regarding the Retreat and Confirmation dates and times. However, we are trying to schedule the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the candidates sometime in March. Please be aware, if your family is not registered at St. Henry Parish your child must receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the parish where you are registered.
- ◆ Regarding who can or can't attend the celebrations of the Sacraments in Church, we will have to wait for the CDC, Archdiocesan and St. Henry Parish guidelines before making that determination. We will keep you updated.
- ◆ Confirmation classes resume TODAY, January 16th (even though this is the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday weekend) and will take place again next Sunday, January 23rd.
