If someone tells you he really likes baseball, and that he lives and dies for the game, yet he has never gone to a real game or even watched baseball on TV, you would not think too much of his claim. If one is really invested in sports, or any activity, one pursues it at least as a spectator, if not a participant, even during the off-season or when the home team is losing. Interest is expressed by action. We measure someone's interest by his or her knowledge of the game, the time spent pursuing it, and how enthusiastically one follows the teams, players, statistics, etc.

Faith is the same way. If you claim to have faith and to believe in God, you pursue those things that support faith: prayer, good works, attending Mass, etc. You move from being a spectator to being an active participant. Our actions point to our beliefs. Doubts, questions, and uncertainty are sure to arise, as we struggle to understand that which is infinite and mysterious. But we work through them and come to a deeper understanding or a greater commitment. When we are invested in faith, we measure it by what we do. We look at how we are changed. We are God's work in progress!

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.
