Think of all the ways that people communicate with one another: post-its, cell phones, fax machines, letters, email, voice mail, movies, videos... All are ways in which we enhance the most basic form of communication -talking. At times, some are more appropriate than others. A wedding invitation is usually not faxed, and love letters are normally not written on post-its. But in a pinch, any method will do.

Prayer is much the same way. There is no right or wrong way to pray. We approach God in prayer, in different ways, at different times in our life. Sometimes our prayer is spontaneous and free flowing; other times, it is more formal and communal. Memorized prayers may bring us more comfort, and new experiences of prayer may help us with a deeper insight into God. The situation,

setting, and our emotions will determine what fits best.

If there is a general "right way" to pray, it would probably be that our prayer be genuine, heartfelt and done with love and confidence. Even in our darkest hours, the Lord is present with us. We may not feel as though we do things in the best possible form, but in life's hard pinch, any way will do. Just remember to bring the most important thing to prayer: yourself.

Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean and a registration card will be mailed to you.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Religious Education

Reminder: First Eucharist, 9th Grade Confirmation and RCIC/RCIA dates and times for the reception of the Sacraments has been mailed to everyone. If you did not receive an email, please call me ASAP. (201-339 – 0319 or 908-612-6674). All who received this information please confirm ASAP.

A First Eucharist timeline will be emailed to parents/guardians shortly. Please watch for it.

A time line for parents/guardians of 9th Grade Confirmation candidates and RCIC/RCIA Catechumens and candidates will also be emailed shortly. Please watch for it.

Ash Wednesday is February 17th (also my birthday). Please check our bulletin as to how and when ashes will be distributed. There are no Wednesday religion classes on Ash Wednesday.

Confirmation classes will take place the 3rd and 4th Sunday of each month. January's classes are scheduled for the 17th and the 24th; February is the 21st and 28th; March is the 21st and 28th and the final classes will take place at 9AM and 7PM on Sunday, April 18th.

An in-person 9th grade Confirmation and adult RCIA Retreat will be held on Saturday, February 27th in St. Henry Church, 1PM—3PM. CDC guidelines will be followed per Fr. Raul our Pastor. The Confirmation Retreat is a prerequisite for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. An official email notification will be sent to all of the parents/guardians of our 9th grade Confirmation candidates. Our adult RCIA candidates will also be sent an email about the retreat date. No food, papers, etc. will be distributed during the Retreat. All attendees are required to wear masks and will be seated in Church according to CDC guidelines.

A Catechist Team ZOOM meeting took place on Tuesday, January 19th, sharing and reconnecting to happenings in our Religious Education Program. Thank you to the entire Catechetical Team for participating. Any pertinent information discussed will be shared with the families of our Religious Education chidren.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR POLISH-AMERICAN S

TUDENTS - The Kosciuszko Foundation, an American Center of Polish Culture, is offering the Jeanette K. Nieciecka Scholarship for undergraduate studies in the areas of business, nursing and education. Eligible applicants are citizens and legal permanent residents of the United States who are of Polish descent. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required to qualify. Qualified Bayonne, NJ residents who are majoring in business, nursing and education receive first preference. Other NJ residents and majors will be considered if no eligible first preference candidates apply. To apply, students must complete the online application and financial information forms and submit the following supporting materials: a statement of purpose/essay, official transcripts, two letters of recommendation, proof of Polish ancestry, a head shot photo, curriculum vitae (CV), checklist and a \$35 non-refundable application fee. Applications and supporting materials will be accepted through January 15, 2021. Scholarships will be awarded for full-time studies during academic year Fall 2021/Spring 2022.
