Is there a way to measure faith? The simple answer is to say that the measure of faith is love. Faith is manifested by our actions because belief in God calls for a response, especially in our dealings with other people. But what criteria can we use to see if faith is a genuine relationship with God or just a good idea, an acceptance of God's existence? We can measure faith by three criteria: how well it is understood, how much it is practiced, and how deeply it is treasured.

Faith has content, basic information we call doctrine and dogma, that is the core of what we believe. Knowledge of faith gives an indication of how important it is to a person and how interested they are in knowing and understanding it. Since faith calls for action, how well and even how often we practice it gives us an idea as to how much a part of our daily life it truly is. Prayer, worship, acts of charity, and good example or witness are part of the daily routine of living faith. Finally how faith influences our decision-making and our values shows how much we choose what is important, what we do, and how we live, then its value is high. Faith can be measured by the changes and choices it brings to our life.

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Once again this year, we have decided that in order to be safe and avoid having many people in the office all at once, we will not be opening up the new Mass Book as we usually do on a Sunday, in person. Instead we ask those who would like Mass Intentions or Memorial Intentions for 2023 to mail in a list of your requests, written CLEARLY – indicating the date and time, and for whom you wish the intention to be (please also include an alternate date/time for each request), along with your payment, a telephone number and an email address.

Intentions will be entered into the Mass Book in the order of our receipt of your list and payment. We are not limiting the amount of Masses you may request, but ask that you be considerate of others who will also be making their requests. If your request cannot be filled as you indicate or with the alternate you provide, I will call or email you to arrange an available date.

Once your Masses/Memorials are booked, a confirmation of your 2023 Intentions will be emailed to you. If you do not have email, please include your address with your list so the confirmation can be mailed to you instead.

Beginning February 14th, you may stop by the office for a Mass Card or Mass Intention, Monday through Thursday, 9AM – 3PM; or if you need a Mass Card and cannot come into the office during our regular hours, you can call Jean at the office, 201-436-0857, Ext. 110, to arrange for pickup/payment.
