

If your request cannot be filled as you indicate or with the alternate you provide, I will call or email you to arrange an available date.

Once your Masses/Memorials are booked, a confirmation of your 2024 Intentions will be emailed to you. If you do not have email, please include your address with your list so the confirmation can be mailed to you instead.

Beginning February 13th, you may stop by the office for a Mass Card or Mass Intention, Monday through Thursday, 9AM – 3PM; or if you need a Mass Card and cannot come into the office during our regular hours, you can call Nancy at the office, 201-436-0857, Ext. 110, to arrange for pickup/payment.

There are NO Mass intentions available in 2023. If a Mass intention is required prior to February 13th, it will not be scheduled at St. Henry Church, but will be celebrated privately by one of our retired priests in the Archdiocese.
