Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Nancy at the rectory office — 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Nancy if you would like the form mailed to you

A minimum of 6 months membership with St. Henry Parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Religious Education...

ATTENTION: I have suggested to the catechists to invite the children and their families to hold class instruction in church whenever possible. The season of Lent is a perfect time to bring children and their families together for tours of the church, Stations of the Cross, etc. On Sunday, February 12th, Catechists Isabella DeMoya and Robert Mastromonaco orchestrated a tour during the children's regularly scheduled class time. Nineteen children and eight parents were present. One father was taking pictures and the children were excited to see the baptismal font and the pascal candle, knowing they will be baptized at the Easter Vigil and there will be a new pascal candle. LENT 2023 – St. Henry Church

ASH WEDNESDAY, which is on **February 22nd** this year, marks the beginning of LENT. Masses will be held at 12 Noon and 7PM that day, and we will have a prayer service for distribution of ashes at 4PM.

LENTEN PRAYER - Take home a book for daily prayer and fill the days of Lent with peaceful reflection (available at the doors of church). Kindly take one per family as our supply is limited.

WEEKDAY MASSES – continue to be celebrated at 12 Noon. **Confessions** are heard 9:00-9:30 AM and 4:30 PM – 5:15 PM on Saturdays, 2/25, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, 3/25, 4/1, and 4/8.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS – Fridays, 7PM – Reflections and prayer in the Church presented by the Gatekeepers, February 24th, March 3rd, March 10th, March 17th, March 24th, and March 31st.

GOOD FRIDAY, April 7th, 6PM, Citywide live Stations of the Cross/Procession beginning at St. Mary Star of the Sea Church and concluding at St. Henry Church

ALMSGIVING – Operation Rice Bowl: This Lenten discipline asks us to give up one meal a week and contribute the cost of that meal to the Rice Bowl program. Rice Bowl provides food to the hungry throughout the world. Rice Bowls are available at the doors of the Church. The deadline to return your Rice Bowl is two weeks after Easter.

2023 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2023 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 4, 2023.</u>

Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
