#### Thoughts and Reflections...

In the sport of fishing, a great deal of attention is paid to the lure, a type of artificial fishing bait designed to attract the fish's attention. They are engineered to appeal to the fish's sense of territory, curiosity or aggression.

You and I are not much better than fish at times by our being lured into committing sin by all sorts of attractive temptations. So often, like the poor fish, we take the bait and are hooked. And just like that we fail in our attempts to live as Christ would have us live. All is not lost, however. Our folly is healed by the Sacrament of Reconciliation, accompanied by the collective effort of our Church that leads us to it. Part of that effort is the penitential season of Lent into which we have now entered. Officially, Lent is our annual opportunity to renew our baptismal commitment to Christ and be prepared to enter with Christ into His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. It is our chance to learn from all the lures that have captivated us since last Lent. Yes, we have been cajoled by carelessness and fooled by the folly of impulses. So we are given this season to "swim away", so to speak, from all that and reenter the mainstream that leads us back to Jesus Christ.



## 2023 Archdiocesan ANNUAL APPEAL

The Annual Appeal funds essential programs and ministries at the heart of our Catholic mission in our four counties in the Archdiocese of Newark – namely to proclaim the gospel, to pass on the faith to future generations particularly through the celebration of the sacraments, and to care for the poor and those on the margins.

**OUR PARISH GOAL IS \$46,379. To date \$6,705 has been pledged.** The Archdiocese requires us to meet this goal. If we do not, we must contribute the difference between our goal and the actual amount of pledges received. **LENTEN PRAYER** - Take home a book for daily prayer and fill the days of Lent with peaceful reflection. Kindly take one per family as our supply is limited.

**WEEKDAY MASSES** – continue to be celebrated at 12 Noon. **Confessions** are heard 9:00–9:30 AM and 4:30 PM–5:15 PM on Saturdays, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, 3/25, 4/1, and 4/8.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS – Fridays, 7PM** – Reflections and prayer in the Church presented by the Gatekeepers, March 3rd, March 10th, March 17th, March 24th, and March 31st.

GOOD FRIDAY, April 7th, 6PM, Citywide live Stations of the Cross/Procession beginning at St. Mary Star of the Sea Church and concluding at St. Henry Church.

**ALMSGIVING** – Operation Rice Bowl: This Lenten discipline asks us to give up one meal a week and contribute the cost of that meal to the Rice Bowl program. Rice Bowl provides food to the hungry throughout the world. Rice Bowls are available at the doors of the Church. The deadline to return your Rice Bowl is two weeks after Easter.

#### 2023 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2023 to The</u> <u>Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 4, 2023</u>.

Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.
