Teaching the Good News


Due to the COVID 19 Pandemic, St. Henry Religious Education classes will be held remotely for the 2020/2021 program year.

All of us wish we could be holy, we say, if only Jesus would come and do to the temple of our faith what he did to the temple of Israel's faith: cast out what doesn't belong, because we don't seem to be able to do it for ourselves, at least not with much effectiveness. We try to pray and find ourselves daydreaming about what to make for supper, about the latest family argument, about the meeting we're going to attend, about where we're going to spend our money.

We try to simplify, but we also like our lives the way they are. We like the cut of style, the thick of our lawn, the escape of vacation, the high from shopping or chocolate or daytime soaps or whatever catches our fancy. We wish we would love better, care better, have more compassion or patience, be more generous, but original sin always gets in the way—only we don't call it original sin. We say we don't have will-power or the energy.

So what are we to do? We are promised that God will come and drive such stuff from our lives. In fact, the promise is that God will do it whether we wish God to or not, which is probably a good move on God's part because most of us are a bit fearful

of what God may clear away.

As much as we may want the temples of our lives cleared, we also *like* much of what takes up our lives. Still, God does come and does clear our temples in unsuspecting ways. What is God asking us to clear away today?

Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office — 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean and a registration card will be mailed to you.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

LENT 2021 -St Henry Church

Weekday Masses continue to be celebrated at 12 Noon.

Confessions are heard 9:00 – 9:30 AM and 4:30 – 5:15 PM on Saturdays February March 13th, 20th & 27th.

Stations of the Cross – Fridays, 7PM – Reflections and prayer in the Church presented by the Gatekeepers. March 12th, 19th & 26th.

Almsgiving—Operation Rice Bowl: This Lenten discipline asks us to give up one meal a week and contribute the cost of that meal to the Rice Bowl program. Rice Bowl provides food to the hungry throughout the world. Rice Bowls are available at the doors of the Church. Deadline to return your Rice Bowl is two weeks after Easter. Call our Religious Education program, 201-339-0319, with any questions.

2021 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obligated by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent</u>, <u>February 21st to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity</u>, <u>May 30</u>, <u>2021</u>.
- * Canon 920, § 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Our Lenten Music

The music for our weekend Masses reflects the spirit of the Lenten season—quiet reflection and prayer. We sing the "Kyrie Eleison". Translation from the Greek is "Lord, have mercy". This prayer goes back to the very early church. It was sung as a processional and gathering hymn for those coming to celebrate Eucharist.

We will use a more contemporary setting of Psalm 51: "Create in me a Clean Heart" as our seasonal Psalm.

Several other Mass parts will be sung using the 13th C. Benedictine chant "Adoro Te Devote", a melody loved and promoted by St. Thomas Aquinas.

No organ postludes are played during Lent. Instead, we leave rather quietly. They will again be heard at Easter. May the spirit and sound of our Lenten music help us to better experience this season of prayer, charity and fasting.
