Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office — 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean and a registration card will be mailed to you.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Religious Education

An email will be sent to all parents/guardians of our 9th Grade Confirmation candidates announcing the one and only date for their receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation – Sunday, April 25th at 2PM in St. Henry Church. Confirmation practice is scheduled for Thursday, April 22nd at 7 PM in St. Henry Church. Due to COVID 19, still a very big part of our lives, CDC guidelines will be followed. Attendance at the Confirmation celebration will be as follows: Candidate, both parents (no substitutes) and Sponsor – only if he/she lives in the same household. If the sponsor does not live in the same household, then the parent will act as sponsor by proxy. No sponsor documentation is necessary for the parent. The sponsor selected by the Confirmation candidate will be the official name recorded as the sponsor in the parish records. As for practice on April 22nd, only the sponsor living in the same household should attend, and if the parent will be the proxy sponsor, he/she should attend the practice. If your request cannot be filled as you indicate or with the alternate you provide, I will call or email you to arrange an available date.

Once booked, a confirmation of your Mass/Memorial Intentions for 2022 will be emailed to you. If you do not have email, please include your address on your list, and the confirmation will be mailed to you.

LENT 2021 - St Henry Church

Weekday Masses continue to be celebrated at 12 Noon.

Confessions are heard 9:00 – 9:30 AM and 4:30 – 5:15 PM on Saturdays February March 20th & 27th.

Stations of the Cross – Fridays, 7PM – Reflections and prayer in the Church presented by the Gatekeepers. March 19th & 26th.

Almsgiving—Operation Rice Bowl: This Lenten discipline asks us to give up one meal a week and contribute the cost of that meal to the Rice Bowl program. Rice Bowl provides food to the hungry throughout the world. Rice Bowls are available at the doors of the Church. Deadline to return your Rice Bowl is two weeks after Easter. Call our Religious Education program, 201-339-0319, with any questions.

2021 Lenten Regulations

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obligated by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent, February 21st</u> to <u>The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity</u>, <u>May 30</u>, 2021.
- * Canon 920, § 1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Dispensation from Abstinence from Meat - Friday, March 19th

Please note the following letter to the faithful of the Archdiocese of Newark, in part, from Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin:

"...The Solemnity of Saint Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is commemorated on March 19th and, this year, that celebration falls on a Friday. What is more, last December, Pope Francis announced a special Year of St. Joseph to be celebrated from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021.

Some of the faithful have asked me to dispense the Archdiocese from abstinence from meat on Friday, March 19, 2021. I am happy to grant that dispensation to all as part of the celebration of this Solemnity during the Year of St. Joseph.

A most fitting way to celebrate the Solemnity is a festive meal with your household and a gift to one of our food pantries or soup kitchens to ensure that the poor will eat as well.
