Thoughts and Reflections: He poured himself out for us and for our salvation, certainly suffering physically from the beating, the scourging, the crowning with thorns, being struck with reed, spat upon, prodded, pushed, and stumbling up the hill to Golgotha. Then he was stretched out on a crossbeam, nailed to it, and lifted up, his body suspended between heaven and earth. There was also the inner suffering of abandonment, seeing his disciples run off, of realizing that all those who had cried "Hosanna" a few days earlier had been silent or had cried out "Crucify him".

Today, when we take home a piece of palm, it invites us to prepare to renew our baptismal promises on Easter. Then we can add our voices to that solitary voice almost two millennia ago, saying, "Truly this is the Son of God".

Loving God, lift up our hearts to give you thanks and praise for all you have done for us through the saving death of your son. We sing out, "Blessed is he who continues to come in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest".
