He poured himself out for us and for our salvation, certainly suffering physically from the beating, the scourging, the crowning with thorns, being struck with a reed, spat upon, prodded, pushed, and stumbling up the hill to Golgotha. Then he was stretched out on a crossbeam, nailed to it, and lifted up, his body suspended between heaven and earth. There was also the inner suffering of abandonment, of seeing his disciples run off, of realizing that all those who had cried "Hosanna" a few days earlier had either been silent or had cried out "Crucify him".

Today, when we take home a piece of palm, it invites us to prepare to renew our baptismal promises on Easter. Then we can add our voices to that solitary voice almost two millennia ago, saying, "Truly, this is the Son of God!"

Loving God, lift up our hearts to give you thanks and praise for all you have done for us through the saving death of your Son. We sing out, "Blessed is he who continues to come in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest".

**Component:** "The Trinity"

**Catechist:** Veronique Pinto

In the component "The Trinity" the Junior High students share and reflect on the mission of the Trinity. They get to know and understand the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. They are learning how God is always there, describing how Jesus is the chosen one and what the role of the Holy Spirit is in their lives. The Ten Commandments are taught in full detail and how to apply them in their daily lives by their words and actions. The children are given tools for the present and future to grow closer to God and how to be authentic to themselves and to others. ### HOLY THURSDAY

The Liturgy at 7:30 PM commemorates the Institution of the Eucharist. The ceremonies are meant to remind us of the great love that God has for us and the love He calls us to share with each other. Plan to spend some time with the Lord on Thursday evening.

### GOOD FRIDAY

Good Friday is the day we commemorate the Crucifixion and Death of Our Savior. It is a SOLEMN DAY which we observe by Fast and Abstinence and a special Liturgy. At 3:00 PM will be the Liturgy of the Passion of Our Lord. Communion will be distributed at that time only. At 7:30 PM we will have the Living Stations of the Cross presented by the youth of our parish. Charity: Our parish, once a year on Good Friday, is called on to support Christians in the Holy Land. Many Christians in the Holy Land depend on the collection for their lives. As a pontifical collection requested by Pope Francis, the annual Good Friday Collection offers a direct link for parishioners to be witnesses of peace and to help protect the Holy places. Please be as generous as your can.

### EASTER VIGIL

The Easter Vigil is the most solemn and important Eucharist the Church celebrates during the year. Christ's Resurrection is the pivot-point around which our lives turn. The living Christ penetrates our lives in innumerable ways, drawing us to the Father through His work in each of us. At the Vigil Mass, Christ has been raised from the dead, raising us with Him to new life and that is something to CELEBRATE. It is a time to rejoice and stand in awe of, something to SING ABOUT, something to make us SHOUT with joy and gladness and thanksgiving. We invite all of our parish family to share in the Vigil Mass on Saturday at 8:30 PM. It begins with the blessing of new fire and blessing of the Easter water. The vigil culminates all of our Lenten efforts to reform our lives and live a new life in Christ.

### *An Easter Gift to your Church*

The Feast of the Resurrection is near and our chance to celebrate this great event has a spiritual as well as a temporal dimension. We rejoice in what the Lord has won for us, and we express our thanks by lives renewed in faith. We are asked to express our faith by supporting our church. Specifically, we need to support our parish. **VEILING** — The third typical edition of the Roman Missal provides a rubric at the beginning of the texts for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, which allows that: "the practice of covering crosses and images in the Church from the Fifth Sunday of Lent is permitted, according to the judgement of the Conference of Bishops. Crosses remain veiled until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday; images remain veiled until the beginning of the Easter Vigil". The option of veiling images and crosses is left to the discretion of the local pastor and is not a required practice.
