On the Second Sunday of Easter in the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope Saint John Paul II proclaimed to the world that "from now on through the Church this Sunday will be called Divine Mercy Sunday". The main point for all of us today is to remember all that Jesus did for us, and to highlight God's perennial posture of mercy toward us sinners. That is all well documented in the book that we call "the bible". No matter how you read it, on paper or on electronic screen, the truth in it will set you

free. Don't be one of the many Christians who expect the world to respect a book they neglect. It documents real mercy like no other.
