Most popular sports involve either an individual player or a whole team getting a ball of some kind into a container of some kind. The "container" could well be a wide receiver's hand in the end zone for football. Or a basket for basketball; a net for soccer, rugby and hockey; a cup for golf. It all seems silly to describe a sport this way, so disproportionate to the number of players involved; the number of fans and the number of dollars attached to the professional players salaries.

But of course we are talking here about fun; also about healthy physical activity; human interaction and character formation all wrapped up as one. Sports are enjoyable for the element of calling human life "a game". High achievers in the business world, or in academia, or even in the Church are likely to be described as having "played the game" to get where they are.

Living the Christian life is hardly a "game", although it does have a goal. That is why Jesus does not describe His followers as "players" and Himself as "coach". On the other hand, we do say of a good player that he or she "has their heart in the game". Our hearts are what Jesus is after. That's what "remaining on the vine" entails. If we don't have our hearts in this serious enterprise of being a full time Christian, then it's fair to say that we are just "playing the game". Giving God an hour a week and acting pagan the rest of the time fits that sad description of a part time Christian.. Scripture offers a clear prescription for both improvement and a joy-filled life. "Children, let us love not in word and speech, but in deed and in truth". Indeed!

If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.
