Our Confirmations will take place on Tuesday, June 2nd and Friday, June 4th, 7 PM in St. Henry's Church. Fr. Raul will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on both nights. All Confirmation Candidates are asked to arrive at 6:15 – 6:30 PM for seating and instructions. There will be no practice. Candidates are asked to bring the 4 booklets, name tag and Confirmation stole. A total of four (4) people, only, may attend Confirmation: the Candidate, Sponsor, 2 parents. No substitutes, please. Confirmation celebrations will be live-streamed for those who are not able to attend. If the original sponsor is unable to attend the Confirmation, then a parent will sponsor by proxy.
