Thoughts and Reflections.

The crescendo of any great symphony is something the listener feels as well as hears. Sitting in the concert hall, he or she knows that it has been building. When it reaches its climax, all will know that they have not only heard a great piece, they have experienced its power.

Ever since Easter, we have spent a month of Sundays reflecting on its meaning and power, like we do after hearing a masterpiece. Like a symphony, the recollection of Christ's several post-resurrection appearances, to individuals and crowds, started off in small "notes" and grew to the power of a full composition. The great impact of all this reaches its climax next Sunday, with the sound and fury that is Pentecost. But before that, the Church puts before us the quiet power of Christ's prayer for unity. The Lord looks beyond the people in front of Him, down the long corridor of time to all the disciples yet to come, including us. He prays that we will be one, able to forge a bond stronger than our individual differences that links us to Himself.

As the great Easter season comes to an end, may we realize how blessed we are to be persons of faith. May that realization be a source of renewed energy to practice what Christ preached. Then someday we will hear and experience heavenly music never heard before. That will only come about because we have first noticed, loved, and imitated that same Composer.

Catholic Cemeteries Price adjustment Effective June 8, 2025

In response to inflation and rising labor costs, Catholic Cemeteries will implement a price increase this summer. Originally scheduled for spring, the adjustment has been postponed until June 8, 2025. We are providing this information so all Catholics in the Archdiocese of Newark are provided with burial options in our cemeteries and are given an opportunity to plan ahead.

Effective June 8, 2025, there will be broad increases at Catholic Cemeteries. We feel it is our duty to inform our parishes that all graves will increase by at least \$300 dollars, all foundations \$150 dollars or more. Mausoleum crypts, lettering, and cremation spaces will also increase. Labor fees will increase as well.

Catholic Cemeteries encourages pre-planning at the following Cemeteries experiencing a price adjustment:
