It is truly right and just that we give full recognition, honor and thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us. It is the Church's true and greatest treasure: the Body and Blood of Christ, "Corpus Christi" in the traditional Latin name of today's feast. This sacrament is Christ himself: Body, blood, soul and divinity.

Simply put, it all began when Jesus took real bread and wine and identified Himself with them. With centuries of Church history behind us, concomitant with the development of her doctrine and devotion, more could be said and has been. Saints, male and female, together with popes and theologians have had their say, and we can all benefit from them. But the fact remains that we start with the remarkably simple ritual gesture done by a man who was facing death.

It happened on a night two thousand plus years ago in the upper room of a borrowed house in the city of Jerusalem amid that city's most hectic time of year, the annual Passover. It happened in a world lit only by fire. But the greater fire of mutual love between mankind and God has stayed lit, despite the tempests of war and human folly ever since.

Classroom Happenings

As this program year has come to an end, here are some of the highlights of what took place in the some of the classrooms. Thanks to all of our Catechists for their dedication and love of our children!

Junior High Class – Nina Talao-Pazymino

The class starts with one of the students leading a Prayer to St. Thomas Aquinas and ends with the Glory Be, Memorare, St. Michael Prayer and Angel of God.

The "Christ In Us" book is the main material and is supplemented by text and exercises from the "Baltimore Catechism".

Sometimes before the lessons begin, the students and their families were invited to pray the Holy Rosary or the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. The Holy Rosary was also prayed in class at times, with different students leading each mystery.

Junior High Class - Marie Pope

Obviously, this year's Religious Education instruction was a whole new experience. We had to learn how to use the various platforms and many helpful resources which were available. Remote teaching would not have been as successful as it was, were it not for the capable, knowledgeable, and resourceful classroom assistant, Joceline DeMoya, a 9th grader. Our class consisted of 22 students, 6th, 7th and 8th grades.

We covered the Liturgical calendar, the Ten Commandments, the 7 Sacraments, various saints, the rosary, Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday rituals, recited the Stations of the Cross, and viewed many videos on these subjects, as well as viewing our St. Henry Advent Candle being lit. We also reinforced the videos by playing the game Kahoot. Every student who placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the Kahoot weekly challenge received a gift from me in the mail recognizing their accomplishments. We also discussed the Pandemic and who in the students' lives helped with the various related issues. Parents, guardians, brothers and sisters would also join our classes at times and participate in answering questions as well. It was an added attraction to the whole remote learning concept. At the end of each class, the students were given the opportunity to rate the class on a scale of 1 to 5. This enabled me to insure that my teaching methods and subject matter resonated with the students. I am so proud that the students elected to not end our class a week early when given the opportunity to do so, but rather to end the class on the original scheduled date. All in all, it was a very successful year of teaching regardless of the method. Each student was sent a bracelet "Jesus Loves You" and complimented for their active participation, kindness and loving manner in which they were all engaged in the weekly sessions.

Thank you to all of my students for being faith-filled and thirsting for spiritual nourishment. You are all saints here on earth. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday—Thursday, 9 AM—3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.


