Religious Education...

Registration and Re-Registration for the 2017/2018 Religious Education Program continues through June 30th, Monday through Thursday, 9 AM to 12 Noon and Tuesday evenings, 6–8 PM. Fees are as follows:

1 child - \$75

2 or more children - \$125

Sacramental Fees:

Reconciliation/First Communion - \$75/child

Confirmation - \$100/child

Registration and Re-Registration will begin again on Monday, July 10th and will continue through August and early September. Fees will be as follows:

1 child - \$100

2 or more children - \$150

Sacramental Fees:

Reconciliation/First Communion - \$75/child

Confirmation - \$100/child

Registration & Re-Registration beginning the week of July 10th will also be Monday through Thursday, 9 AM to 12 Noon and Tuesday evenings, 6–8 PM.

The Religious Education Office is CLOSED ON FRIDAYS.

Important Change in the Registration Process for 2017/2018:

If your child/children were registered and attended our Religious Education Program for the 2016/2017 time frame, you do not have to complete a new Registration form for 2017/2018 as long as we have a form on file.

You may pay the registration fee by check or money order (payable to St. Henry Church) or you may use our Parish Giving Program (www.pariishgiving.org). Cash must be processed in person.

RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation

If you are an adult and would like to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion and Confirmation or you would like to become Catholic, we have a program that can accommodate your needs. RCIA classes begin in October 2017. Classes are held on the 1st and 2nd Monday of each month beginning October 2nd, 7 to 8 PM in St. Henry School.

Catch-Up Classes

If your child/children will be in 3rd grade and above in the Fall and have been Baptized, but have not received First Communion, we have a program that can prepare them to receive First Communion. It is a 2 year program and classes are held on Sunday mornings 8:45to 9:45 AM.

RCIC – Rite of Christian Initiation for Children

If you have a child/children who have not been Baptized, we have a 2 year program that can assist you and your child/children to prepare to receive all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation).
