Mass Celebrations Have Begun!

The Church opened last week for the celebration of daily weekday Masses. In order to save on energy costs, there is only ONE daily Mass, at 12 Noon, Monday through Saturday.

We continue to livestream via our Facebook page (St. Henry RC Church) to enable those who cannot be physically present to participate.

In addition, weekend Masses will be now be Celebrated, at the usual scheduled times: 5:30 PM on Saturday and 8AM, 10AM and 12PM, beginning this weekend, June 20th & 21st

Those who attend are asked to please:

- 1) Check your temperature at home before coming to insure you do not have a fever. If you are feeling ill, please stay at home.
- 2) Wear a mask while in the Church.
- 3) Practice social distancing. Seats available in the church are marked by blue tape. Only families who stay in the same house can be seated together.
- 4) Do not shake hands during the Sign of Peace.
- 5) For Communion, remain in your seats. The Priest or Eucharistic Minister will come to you to give you Communion. Communion will be received in hand only. The Chalice with the Blood of Christ will not be ministered. Anyone who does not wish to receive Communion should place their arms across their chest to signify this.

CONFESSIONS will continue to be heard on SATURDAYS, 10:30 AM to 11:00 AM. Both myself and Fr. Alfie will be available for Confessions, one in the Reconciliation Room and one in St. Benedict Chapel.

We are grateful for your consistent efforts as we try to keep up with our ongoing expenses. Many of you are sending in your offerings or donating electronically through Parish Giving. If you have not already done so, please consider doing what you can to help.

Let us continue to pray for our Lord's guidance as we patiently and safely return to the celebration of Mass in St. Henry Church. May God continue to bless all of you and keep you safe.
