Each year the Church celebrates the feast of Corpus Christi. It is this jewel that is the source and summit of the Christian life. The main reason for the Church's existence. The principal reason for the priesthood. It is important for us Catholics, especially in our pluralistic culture and one that prefers everybody to blend in, that we be very clear in how we differ from Protestant Christians who believe that the Eucharist is only a symbol. That Christ was only speaking metaphorically. We instead believe that the bread and wine, consecrated at the Mass, through the words of Christ spoken by the celebrating priest, really and truly become the living Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Through the Eucharist our faith has the chance to be renewed, our hope becomes reinvigorated and our charity is re-energized. This means ultimately that none of us need go spiritually hungry ever again. Humbly we pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven, give us this day our daily Bread".

Bishop Hyacinth shepherds the rural areas of Delta State in the South of Nigeria where although the Catholic faith is thriving, the economic situation of the people is deplorable, with them having no access to potable water, roads, hospitals, schools, electricity, etc. The main source of drinking water is from a polluted river which explains why the death rate is so high among children, pregnant women and the elderly. The Diocese, in order to effectively preach the love of God and save precious lives being lost to diseases, is making an effort to provide clean water. How to Report Abuse The Archdiocese takes very seriously any and all allegations of sexual misconduct by members of the clergy, Religious and lay staff of the Archdiocese. We encourage anyone with knowledge of an act of sexual misconduct to inform us immediately so that we may take appropriate action to protect others and provide support to victims of sexual abuse. Individuals who wish to report allegation of sexual misconduct may do so by calling the Archdiocesan Office of Child & Youth Protection at 973-497-4011.

From the ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK...

VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAM - The Archdiocese of Newark, along with the other R.C. dioceses in New Jersey, has established an independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Archdiocese. The IVCP is open to claims as of June 15th. The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims and will operate independently of the Archdiocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established protocol. All victims, no matter when the abuse occurred, are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially. The IVCP is a continuation of the goals set out by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, in his Forward in Faith: Our Road Ahead plan for the people of the Archdiocese of Newark. He says, "This program is a sign of our commitment to the continued healing of victims who were sexually abused as a minor by a member of our Archdiocesan clergy." "It is a genuine expression of our remorse and our desire to make amends for past transgressions, and I sincerely hope it will meaningfully assist victims and bring them a measure of peace." Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.


