How to Report Abuse The Archdiocese takes very seriously any and all allegations of sexual misconduct by members of the clergy, Religious and lay staff of the Archdiocese. We encourage anyone with knowledge of an act of sexual misconduct to inform us immediately so that we may take appropriate action to protect others and provide support to victims of sexual abuse. Individuals who wish to report allegation of sexual misconduct may do so by calling the Archdiocesan Office of Child & Youth Protection at 973-497-4011.

From the ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK...

VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAM - The Archdiocese of Newark, along with the other R.C. dioceses in New Jersey, has established an independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Archdiocese. The IVCP is open to claims as of June 15th. The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims and will operate independently of the Archdiocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established protocol. All victims, no matter when the abuse occurred, are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially. The IVCP is a continuation of the goals set out by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, in his *Forward in Faith: Our Road Ahead* plan for the people of the Archdiocese of Newark. He says, "This program is a sign of our commitment to the continued healing of victims who were sexually abused as a minor by a member of our Archdiocesan clergy." "It is a genuine expression of our remorse and our desire to make amends for past transgressions, and I sincerely hope it will meaningfully assist victims and bring them a measure of peace." Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

We are using a Seasonal Responsorial Psalm this week and will continue to use it until September. It is Psalm 92. The musical setting was composed by the Canadian composer, Michel Guimont. Your sung response is **"Lord, it is good to give thanks to You, to give thanks to You."**

The purpose of the Seasonal Psalm is to give you the opportunity to memorize and savor it (through weekly repetition). We encourage you to follow the lead of the Cantor on this beautiful refrain.
