July 11, 2021 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



We know the content of the Bible has been fixed for some time, although the message it sends is for all time. The mission and message of the Church endure to this very day. A calling goes out to each one of us from the same Jesus who started it all with its foundation on St. Peter and his calling. God's call to us is hardly random or mechanical. Its purpose is to reveal to the world the message it needs to hear. One which generates a peace and satisfaction to the human heart that the things of this world simply cannot.

We know deep down the truth of this belief. At a certain point in life we realize that all this striving, this compulsion of competition, this push for power, wealth, honor and fame is all just "sound and fury" as Mr. Shakespeare wisely pointed out. What God wants you and me to real-

ize also is that we have our mission, our calling. It is mysterious, yes. It can also be irksome. But it is good, above all. Here are Saint John Henry Cardinal Newman's thoughts on this matter: "God has created me to do Him some definite service: He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place while not intending it – if I do but keep His commandments. Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him. In perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him. In sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. He does nothing in vain. He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends; he may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink; hide my future from me - still He knows what He is about."

Registration – 2021-2022 Program

In-person registration for the 2021-2022 Religious Education Program will be as follows:

Beginning the week of Monday, July 11th and throughout the entire month of July, registrations will take place in St. Henry School:

Mondays, 3PM – 5PM Wednesdays, 3PM – 5PM Fridays, 10AM – 12PM

Classes are:

<u>Kindergarten – 5th Grade</u> * includes 1st and 2nd year catch-up & RCIC Sunday, 8:30AM – 9:45AM

<u>1st – 5th Grades</u> Wednesday, 3:45PM – 5PM

<u>Junior High (6th, 7th 7 8th Grades</u> Wednesdays, 6:45PM – 8PM

Confirmation Students

3rd & 4th Sunday of each month, beginning October, 10:30AM – 11:55 PM. Mass attendance at 12 Noon.

All families must be registered at one of the four parishes in Bayonne. However, the child/children may attend any one of the 4 Religious Education programs. Times and days of the week of classes are printed on the registration forms. You may register your family for St. Henry Parish while completing the Religious Education registration form. Note: Children receiving Sacraments must do so at the parish where the family is registered.

Registration Fees:

\$75/child; \$125 two or more children, until September 1, 2021 – fees then increase to \$100/child and \$150 two or more children.

Sacramental fees: \$75/child for both the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist \$100/child for Confirmation *Sacramental fees do not increase at any time.

Registration and Sacramental fees may be paid by check payable to St. Henry Church, cash (a receipt will be provided) or Money Order. We will not accept online payments.

Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

St. Henry Mass Schedule – Additional Information:

We will no longer be livestreaming our weekday Masses and ONLY the 12 Noon Mass on Sunday will be livestreamed on the weekend.

Please note that we CONTINUE to celebrate one Mass each weekday at 12 Noon and the scheduled intentions for 8:30 AM and 12:05 PM will be honored together at this Mass.

The decision was made to continue to celebrate one Mass each weekday as the St. Benedict chapel is too small to comfortably and safely accommodate too many communicants and it is too expensive to cool or heat the main church from early morning to after the 12:00 PM Mass. We plan to revisit this decision in a few months to determine when we can go back to our regular weekday Mass schedule. Thank you for your understanding!
