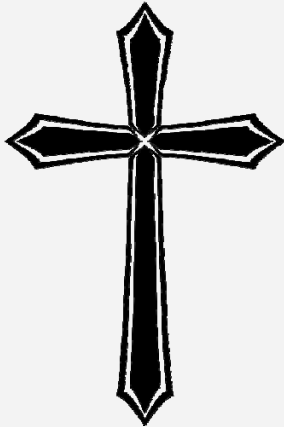

Following that instruction, he found that the almanac entry was a list of the top hitters in the annals of baseball, with Ty Cobb leading the pack with a .376 batting average. Puzzled as to how this applied to his problem, he returned to the priest for an explanation. The priest explained that the page of Hall of Fame hitters represented people who in essence failed about seven out of every ten times at bat.

So if he thought his track record of failure was a problem, he needed to think again. The many failures put him in a league with some of the greatest hitters baseball had ever known.

Jesus sent off his disciples, instructing them in advance not to expect success in all of their endeavors. So when they fail, they are to "shake the dust from their feet" and move on. It is an instruction that is needed by any who fail.

To All Parents/Guardians:

Please be sure to complete a 2019/2020 Religious Education form for all new and re-registrations. If you did not receive a form you may pick it up from our Religious Education Office (see hours above). Registration forms and payments are to be mailed to St. Henry Rectory, 82 West 29th St., Bayonne, NJ 07002, Attn: Marie Pope. Please be sure to write at the top of the form the day of the week you would prefer your child/children to attend classes. If your child/children are new to St. Henry's program, a copy of his/her baptismal certificate must accompany the registration form if he/she was not baptized at St. Henry. If your child was baptized at St. Henry, we only require the month and year of baptism. If your child received First Eucharist at another parish, we also require a copy of that document or the name of the parish, city and state. For more information call Marie Pope at 908-612-6674.

Please note that the registration fee has increased to \$100/child and \$150 for 2 or more children. Sacramental fees remain the same: \$100/child for confirmation and \$75/child for both sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAM - The Archdiocese of Newark, along with the other R.C. dioceses in New Jersey, has established an independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Archdiocese. The IVCP is open to claims as of June 15th. The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims and will operate independently of the Archdiocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established protocol. All victims, no matter when the abuse occurred, are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially. The IVCP is a continuation of the goals set out by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, in his *Forward in Faith: Our Road Ahead* plan for the people of the Archdiocese of Newark. He says, "This program is a sign of our commitment to the continued healing of victims who were sexually abused as a minor by a member of our Archdiocesan clergy." "It is a genuine expression of our remorse and our desire to make amends for past transgressions, and I sincerely hope it will meaningfully assist victims and bring them a measure of peace." Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Our Summer Music...

We are using a Seasonal Responsorial Psalm through September - Psalm 92. The musical setting was composed by the Canadian composer, Michel Guimont. Your sung response is "**Lord, it is good to give thanks to You, to give thanks to You.**"

The purpose of the Seasonal Psalm is to give you the opportunity to memorize and savor it (through weekly repetition). We encourage you to follow the lead of the Cantor on this beautiful refrain.

The other Mass parts to be sung during the Summer have been selected from familiar sources for easy singing. Since the Parish Choir, music ensembles and children's choir "take vacation time" in the Summer, we urge you to fully participate in the liturgy by "singing your heart out".

The Sisters of St. Joseph English As A Second Language (ESL) Classes St. Henry School Building

Registration for the new program—MORNINGS, 10AM to 12PM (September 17 to December 19) will take place in the Bayonne Library Gallery (2nd Fl.) on Tuesday, August 13th, 10AM to 1PM; Wednesday, August 21st, 1PM to 4PM; Monday August 26th, 1PM to 4PM; and Thursday, September 5th, 10AM to 1PM.

Registration for the new program—EVENINGS, 6:30PM to 8:30PM (September 19th to December 19th) will take place August 22nd and September 12th, 7:00 to 8:30 PM, in the Bayonne Library Gallery (2nd Fl.).

All classes are for ADULTS. There are Beginner, Intermediate and High Intermediate classes. Registration fee is \$15 which is given to St. Henry Church. Learners also pay for the book used in class at a cost of \$30 which is ordered for you. However, you may also order it yourself if you wish. Those in intermediate classes also use a newspaper, Easy English News, and the price for the four months is about \$7.

- Everyone has to register, including those who were in our 2018-2019 classes.
- Bring something that shows your name, address, phone number and country where you were born.
- A placement test will be given to help decide what class would be best for each person who registers.
