July 24, 2022 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Sometimes prayer is easy – times of thanksgiving, times before a big test or an important appointment, times of fear and anxiety, times of mourning for persons we love as they near death. At other times, prayer is difficult – when we are angry at the crazed, violent or heartless behavior of someone or when we know we are supposed to pray for those we consider our enemies. Easy or difficult, we know we have an obligation to pray. It springs from the fact that there is a God who created us and we are here on earth as His creatures. It is an obligation that derives from love, however, rather than law. It is worth the time and effort it takes for that reason alone.

Prayer seems difficult sometimes, possibly because of certain attachments we make to it such as kneeling as the only correct posture for prayer or that it is a must that prayer be done early in the morning. However, the truth is that prayer may be offered at any time, but make it at the best time for you. And do it at the same time every day. The main thing is for all of us to be praying people and to persevere.

The greatest form of prayer is praise. We do not ask anything of ourselves, but simply praise God for who He is and all He has done for us.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (RCIA)

RCIA is a program for adults over 18 who would like to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion and/or Confirmation. If you have not been baptized you will receive all 3 sacraments which are called the Sacraments of Initiation.

If interested or if you have any questions, call Marie Pope at 908-612-6674, who will be teaching the class in a remote capacity via Zoom. There is no fee. You will need to provide a copy of your baptism and first communion certificates (if applicable) as well as your marriage certificate (church or cival) if married. If you do not have your sacramental records you may obtain them by calling the church where you received them. If you need help with this, let Marie know.

You should be registered with St. Henry Parish in order to receive the sacraments here. If you are registered at another parish, that is where you should receive the sacraments. If you are not registered at a parish and wish to register at St. Henry's, you may do so by going to the Parish Office Monday – Thursday, 9AM – 3PM or call 201-436-0857, ext. 110.

You will be asked to select a godparent/sponsor (one) for the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. It will be the same person for both sacraments. He or she must be a practicing Catholic, be registered in a parish, be 16 years of age or older, Baptized, received First Eucharist and Confirmation. It may be a man or a woman. He or she must obtain a "sponsor certificate" from his/her current parish.

During class times you will be asked to select a saint's name for Confirmation; write a letter to the bishop explaining why you feel you are ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation; write a letter to your sponsor explaining why you selected him or her.

Class dates/times have not yet been determined (in the past, using Zoom, classes were held early Sunday afternoons).

Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

NEXT WEEKEND, July 30th & 31st Fr. Binoj Mathew of the Order of the Most Holy Trinity will be visiting our parish for a mission appeal. Fr. Binoj serves as the Novice Master for the Immaculate Heart of Mary Province, USA. At each of the Masses, Father will ask for our prayers and financial assistance as his Order works to expand its ministry of Catholic education in Kamrup (Assam) India. Most of the Christians in this secluded part of the country belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. The children do not have access to a proper education due to extreme poverty and persecution. The Trinitarians in India hope to expand their ministry of Catholic education through their newly opened DeMatha Elementary School. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a Monastery for the religious, a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium. Please consider supporting the work of the Trinitarians in India as they continue to spread God's mercy and redemption in this remote part of the world.
