

SANCTUARY LAMP In Memory of Geraldine Fincken From Amanda Kline ALTAR BREAD & ALTAR WINE In Memory of Mark Groendyk From Frank & Jean DiPillo **Thoughts and Reflections**... The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord commemorates one of the pinnacles of Jesus' earthly life, when he revealed his divinity to three of his closest disciples by means of a miraculous and supernatural light. Before his triumphant entry into Jerusalem, Christ climbed to a high point on Mount Tabor with his disciples Peter, James, and John. While Jesus prayed upon the mountain, his appearance was changed by a brilliant white light which shone from him and his clothing. During this event Moses and the prophet Elijah also appeared and spoke of how Christ would suffer and die after entering Jerusalem, before his resurrection. Matthew, Mark and Luke all record that the voice of God was heard, confirming Jesus as his son.

The light which shines forth from Christ both at the transfiguration and after his resurrection, is ultimately triumphant over "*the power of the darkness of evil*". Pope Benedict XVI stressed that the Feast of the Transfiguration is an important opportunity for believers to look to Christ as "*the light of the world*", and to experience the kind of conversion which the Bible frequently describes as an emergence from darkness to light.

Continuing this month, we are asking you to please treat St. Henry Church to a cup of coffee. RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION (RCIA):

RCIA is a program for adults over 18 who would like to receive the Sacraments of Communion and/or Confirmation. If you have not been baptized you will receive all three Sacraments which are called the Sacraments of Initiation.

ST. CECELIA FUND St. Henry Church has a proud history of providing excellent sacred music for our Masses and special liturgies. This is financially supported through our parish budget. ANNUAL APPEAL

The Annual Appeal funds essential programs and ministries at the heart of our Catholic mission in our four counties in the Archdiocese of Newark – namely to proclaim the gospel, to pass on the faith to future generations particularly through the celebration of the sacraments, and to care for the poor and those on the margins.

OUR PARISH GOAL IS \$46,379. To date \$38,209 has been pledged and \$37,629 has been received. The Archdiocese requires us to meet this goal. If we do not, we must contribute the difference between our goal and the actual amount of pledges received. We therefore ask that you prayerfully consider making your gift or pledge to 2023 Annual Appeal.

Pledge /Gift envelopes are located at the doors of our church. You may bring your envelope to the Parish Office or add a stamp and mail it directly to the Archdiocese of Newark (do not mail cash). As always, your generosity is appreciated.
