

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

A minimum of 3 months membership with St. Henry Parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. 2024 Archdiocesan Annual Appeal
