

Jesus said it best: to whom much is given, much is expected. All gifts come from God and our abilities are given to us to be used for the benefit of ourselves and of others and at the service of the Gospel. As that hymn used to say, all that we have and all that we are is what we really give to the Lord. For a gift to have a spiritual benefit, our intention and involvement would be part of the consideration. If I give money to a charity, even to a very worthwhile one, but do so in order to gain a tax advantage, it could hardly be a virtuous thing on my behalf. But if I give because I want to help, and in fact, am even willing to get involved, I have committed myself in a deeper, more meaningful way. There's a big difference between writing a check and sending it to an organization that feeds the hungry, and my going to the local soup kitchen and helping serve the meals I may have paid for. The most important element in a spiritual or virtuous act is not intangible — it's me!

Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

# **Religious Education**

### NEW & RE-REGISTRATION 2022-2023 Program

New and re-registrations will continue through the end of next week, Monday through Friday, 3–5PM. Call the Religious Education office prior to arriving – 201-339-0319, Ext. 116.

Fees for registrations are: 1 Child \$100; 2 or more children \$150. Children preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist will pay an additional fee of \$75 per child; children preparing for Confirmation will pay a fee of \$100 per child.

Sunday and Wednesday classes began last week. Confirmation classes will be virtual and will begin Sunday October 16th, either 8:30AM – 9:30AM, 4 – 5PM or 7-8PM.

IMPORTANT: A copy of your child's Baptism certificate must accompany all new registrations. We also require a copy of a Baptism certificate for all children who have previously been enrolled in St. Henry's Religious Education Program.

RCIA for Adults 18 years and older: If you'd like to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation, RCIA classes will begin on Sunday, November 6th, 12PM -1:30 PM. Classes will meet on the first and second Sunday of each month. A calendar will be provided as to when classes will be held or cancelled due to holiday observances and possible emergencies. There is no fee for RCIA. All classes will be conducted remotely. If you are not registered in a parish, please do so as soon as possible. If you'd like to register with St. Henry Parish contact the rectory at 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. The office is open 9AM – 3PM, Monday through Thursday. You may pick up a RCIA application form by calling the Religious Education office at 201-339-0319, Ext. 116. If you have been baptized, your baptism certificate is required. If you received First Eucharist, this certificate is required. If you have difficulty securing documents, call Marie Pope at 908-612-6674 – leave your name and number if no answer. The RCIA team members will be Ericka Rodas, Nancy Kopacz, Veronica Pinto, Peter Khalil, Nina Talao-Pazymino and Marie Pope. For further information, call Marie Pope, number above.
