Every month they come like clockwork. In the mailbox or online. They are the bills for this, that, and the other thing that form our obligations. Such obligations are a real and necessary part of civilized living in our technologically advanced society. But on a higher level, we have to consider from time to time what all human beings in any society inherently realize. We have obligations to God.

Faith was the ultimate motive our parents had for bringing us to the baptismal font when we were too young to appreciate the gift they gave us that day. But it was such a gift! The Divine Trinity not only adopted us but also incorporated us into the very Mystical Body of Christ we call "The Catholic Church". Our faith in Jesus is the ultimate motive for worshipping God at Mass. It includes expressing our love and trust in the God who suffered, died and rose again for us, and who literally yearns for us to live forever with Him in heaven.

Sir Michael Costa, a nineteenth century composer and conductor, was leading a rehearsal in which the orchestra was joined by a great chorus. About halfway through the session, with trumpets blaring, drums rolling, and violins singing their rich melody, the piccolo player muttered to himself, "What good am I doing? I might as well not be playing. Nobody can hear me anyway". So he placed his instrument to his lips but made no sound. Within moments the conductor cried, "Stop, stop! Where's the piccolo". Perhaps many players in the orchestra did not realize that the piccolo was missing, but the most important person did. So it is with Christian life. God notices everything. He knows when we're not playing the part assigned to us, even if others do not. So play your part this week, and watch what happens.
