If your biographer were to ask about the parts of your morning routine, how would you answer? Well, I take a shower? I brush my teeth? Whatever you would say, I hope it would include morning prayer. That's not only good but it's a great way to start the gift of a new day in your life.

We can derive at least two unmistakable qualities of true prayer, no matter when in our day we can do it:

1. No one who is proud can pray. We must "bend down" from any position of pride to reach God in prayer.

2. No one who despises others can pray. If there is someone in your life, be it a family member, neighbor, acquaintance, political figure, office holder, TV commentator, columnist, etc., who is on your list of "detestables" you have to forgive them before praying. Period.

A traveler made a train journey to England. As he passed through Yorkshire he saw a little white-washed cottage that seemed to shine with an almost radiant whiteness. A few days later he made the journey back to Scotland. The snow had fallen and was lying deep all around. When he came again to pass the little white cottage, its whiteness seemed drab and dirty and almost grey in comparison with the pure whiteness of the driven snow. It all depends on with whom or what we compare ourselves. When we set our lives beside the life of Jesus and the holiness of God, all that is left to say, any time we pray is: "O God be merciful to me, a sinner".

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office - 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.
