

**Thoughts and Reflections:** November 2nd, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, dovetails with November 1st, the feast of All Saints. The saints, our models of Christian living, are one with God in heaven. All the faithful departed are those who have died with the hope and trust in a loving God who calls us to greater growth and development, even beyond death. These November feasts vividly remind us of the rich reality known as the communion of saints. This belief stresses the strong affirmation that the church is always one in Christ. Death does not sever any of the bonds that unite us in Christ. That is why it is a fitting practice to pray for the dead and to ask them to pray for us.

**Feast of All Saints**—We Celebrate the Feast of All Saints on Friday, November 1st. We should pause to honor and seek the intercession of our patron saint and all who have died in the Lord. Remember, our destiny is to join with the saints whom we honor living as a holy person and becoming part of the saints in heaven. Masses for this Holy Day of Obligation will take place at 7:00PM Thursday, October 31st, and 12:00PM on Friday, November 1st.

<u>All Souls Day</u>—All Souls Day is Saturday, November 2nd. It is our Catholic tradition to remember all our deceased relatives and friends. Masses will be celebrated at 8:30AM and 5:30PM for our deceased families, friends, benefactors, parishioners, priests and religious.

MASS OF REMEMBRANCE—Next Sunday, November 3rd at 12:00PM, we will celebrate a Mass of Remembrance for all those who were buried from St. Henry Parish from November 2023 through October 2024. We have extended a personal invitation to the families of the deceased. Please be with us as we celebrate and remember those who have been commended to our God from St. Henry Parish over the past year.

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Nancy at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

A minimum of 3 months membership with St. Henry Parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### 1.) What projects is the parish looking to have completed?

The church and school both need a new roof. In order to complete the projects, the parish will be taking a loan from the Archdiocese of Newark. We are looking to have the school roof completed this fall, and the church roof completed in the spring when the weather is warmer.

### 2.) Are pledge payments tax deductible?

Yes, pledge payments are 100 percent tax deductible. At the end of the year you will receive a contributions letter from the parish, which will have all of the contributions you have given to the parish listed.

#### 3.) With the current economic situation, why is the parish looking to conduct a Capital Campaign?

We are aware of the current state of the economy; however doing nothing is seldom the answer. The parish plant faces necessary renovations that must be addressed in order to preserve the structural integrity of our buildings and meet the growing need of our parish community.

We cannot emphasize enough the concept of **Equal Sacrifice Not Equal Giving**. This means that not everybody can make the same size gift, but they can make the same size sacrifice through prayer, consideration, and reflection.
