Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office—201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday—Thursday, 9 AM—3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Spotlight on the Catechist Nina Pazymino

Nina teaches the 6th grade class, and this is her 3rd year teaching at St. Henry's. Nina has always been active in various parish ministries. She was a lector, choir member, Catholic young adult group event organizer and also helps out with the Catholic charismatic group Gatekeepers when she can. She's been learning about Catholic apologetics since 2014, but her calling to be a catechist came to fruition when she attended daily Mass at St. Henry's one day. Fr. Raul's homily that day compelled her to take an active role in the Religious Education ministry. As soon as Mass ended, she approached Fr. Raul who urged her to meet with Ms. Pope. She did so and became a Catechist the following year.

Nina always looks for opportunities to help her students live the faith while learning which is why she encourages active participation in her class and brings in supplemental material from related topics she hears from Relevant Radio, the Formed app and the Baltimore Catechism book for 6th graders. In addition to being an active parishioner of St. Henry's, she also attends traditional Latin Mass and sings with the Latin Mass choir in Jersey City. She continues to attend Baltimore catechism classes for adults.
