Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean and a registration card will be mailed to you.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

St. Henry Religious Education classes for Wednesday, November 4th, grades 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5, begin 4PM to 5PM and the 3rd second grade class begins 6PM to 7PM. Junior High classes will begin the same day, 7PM to 8PM. Catechists will send the necessary information you require to get started. Also, a welcome letter from Sadlier Book Co. was sent to the parents/guardians providing them with the necessary information. If you do not receive notification from your child's catechist, notify me ASAP.

Please keep all of God's children and His Catechists in your thoughts and prayers as we begin the new norm of religious instruction. Thank you to all the families for your support, kindness and love during this difficult time. Thanks be to God for registering over 350 children in our 2020/2021 Religious Education Program.
