It is sometimes a struggle to find the right words to say to friends and relatives during times of grief. Death is something that our culture does not handle well. We tend to shrink away from it and often see it more as a medical failure than a part of life. We are not all that comfortable with feelings of grief or loss either, so feeling awkward at times of loss is very common. The best thing to do is express your sorrow and concern for the person who has lost someone. Often stories and memories of the one who has died can help console the mourners. We all want our loved ones to be remembered, and sharing our thoughts can be very comforting.

The worst thing to do is deny that there is a loss or offer a sentimental comment, like "they are in a better place". While well intentioned, this offers little to the one who is grieving. Perhaps the best thing we can do is simply be present, expressing by simple acts of kindness and support, our love and concern.

Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.
