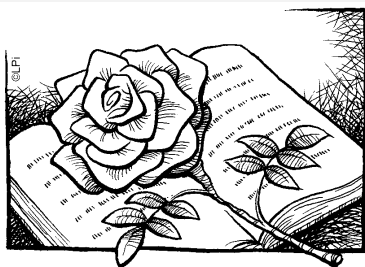

November, the month of All Souls, is dedicated to praying for the dead in a more focused and intentional manner. Catholics believe that praying for those who have died expresses our continual care and concern for those no longer with us. Every Eucharist celebration includes a remembrance of those who have died. The various Eucharistic prayers articulate that remembrance differently. At times we pray simply for "those who have died" while at other times for "those who have died and gone before us marked with the sign of faith". We pray that "these and all who sleep in Christ find in your presence light, happiness and peace". At other times we pray for "our brothers and sisters who have

gone to their rest in the hope of rising again" as we ask God to "bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence". We also pray for "all the dead whose faith is known to you alone".

We do not know how people die in relationship with God. Only God knows. But we firmly believe in God's abundant mercy, grace and love. So, we pray that God's limitless mercy and love shine richly and abundantly upon all who have died.

Parish Registration

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office — 201-436-0857. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, were brought up here or attended St. Henry's school. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and simply complete a registration card. If this is not possible, call Jean at the rectory office. Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.
