They announce; they remind; they warn. They announce the schedule of holy Masses. As such they underscore the importance of taking time out to think of and worship almighty God. They remind the community of how important time is. Perhaps they shake up the listeners who may have gotten drowsy from running "the rat race" without knowing why. Finally, they warn Christians that if you stay away from community worship, as it was recommended by God's own Son, Who told us to "do this" in His memory, you'd better have a good reason. Christ, awaits our coming home to Him. That most of this running around we do down here, packing multiple meanings into many of our decisions, will amount to nothing when we finally get to meet God face to face.

It is possible that our entrance into heaven will depend on the "oil in our lamps", namely our good works. Most of us do try to keep our symbolic lamps lit. We also admire those who do. It is individual good efforts that reflect Christ in the world that keep our lamps in oil.

Teaching through powerful imagery shows clearly that Jesus is the master Teacher. It also means that we pupils are at our best when we pay attention.

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Nancy at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

A minimum of 3 months membership with St. Henry Parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

#### **COFFEE for ST. HENRY**



Continuing this month, we are asking you to please treat St. Henry Church to a cup of coffee. We will use the proceeds to defray the cost of our Repairs and Maintenance, and hopefully, help shore up our reserves again. "*Coffee for St. Henry*" envelopes will be by the doors of the church. However much you want to treat St. Henry for, please put the amount inside the envelope. You can then drop the envelope in the collection basket. You can do this anytime in the month, and as many times as you wish. At the end each month, we will announce in the bulletin how much we collected, just like the regular collection. We are excited to announce that our parish recently received two grants from the Archdiocese of Newark. We received \$25,000 from the Parish Unity Fund and another \$20,000 from the Stewardship Endowment Grant. The Parish Unity Fund is made possible by parishes across the Archdiocese that surpass their Annual Appeal goal. The grant funds are intended to assist parishes in achieving their capital and pastoral goals.

We are thankful and blessed to have received these funds as they provided us with the opportunity to have the much needed school building asbestos removal and repairs completed over the last several months.

**ST. CECELIA FUND** St. Henry Church has a proud history of providing excellent sacred music for our Masses and special liturgies. This is financially supported through our parish budget. There are times during the year when we would like to add special music through instrumentalists (brass choir, string quartet, flute, etc.). We also would like to reserve funds to maintain our historic 50 rank pipe organ. We are establishing the St. Cecelia Fund (Patron of Sacred Music) to support these items. You can make a designated contribution of any amount by writing on your check or envelope "FOR ST. CECELIA FUND" and making the check payable to ST. HENRY CHURCH. We encourage you to help support this sacred music effort. The money will be used by the music ministry as the year progresses. You can also indicate your donation is in honor or memory of a named loved one.
