Kings and kingdoms are not part of the American culture or political experience. Human beings in general—and Americans in particular—tend to resist and oppose any institution that does not allow people to play an active part in the decision-making process. Yet with this last Sunday in ordinary time, we celebrate the feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

The feast was began by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to counter atheism and secularism. Pius wanted to communicate the belief that Jesus is lord of all, the king of creation. The biblical reality, however, is that Jesus is not a king like the kings of this world. These kings "lord" it over their people exercising power, at times without restraint. Jesus is lord indeed; yet he came to serve, not to be served, and to give his life for the sake of all. A monarchial reign is not a characteristic of the kingdom of God.

The kingdom of God that Jesus proclaimed is one in which all people are treated with dignity and valued for who and what they are. It is a kingdom that actively cares for the poor, the homeless, the alienated, and the oppressed, as it mobilizes to establish justice and a right relationship with all. This is what every institution that models itself on Jesus the king has to be about. As we celebrate this feast, let us pray that all institutions, especially the church, model themselves on Jesus' servant leadership.

If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Jean at the rectory office — 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

To register, complete a registration form at the Parish Office, Monday – Thursday, 9 AM – 3:30 PM, or call Jean if you would like the form mailed to you

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Religious Education

Spotlight on the Catechist VERONIQUE PINTO

Veronique Pinto was raised Catholic. As a teenager she was told to go to Mass and as an adult only went on Christmas and Easter. When attending classes for the baptism of her third son, she was told by the priest that she was not married in the eyes of God because her marriage took place at city hall. The priest encouraged her to complete her sacraments too, as she was only baptized at that time. She happened to find a notice in St. Henry's bulletin for RCIA classes; she signed up and attended two hour classes once a week for a year with Msgr. Ed and Fr. Paul. She learned about her Catholic faith and was married in St. Henry Church by Msgr. Ed and began to help out with the RCIA classes which she considers very dear to her heart. Veronique says she has learned a lot on her faith journey, thanks to God, Msgr. Ed, Fr. Paul, Marie Pope and St. Henry's Church.

Marie Pope would ask Veronique every so often to help teaching the children's CCD classes, but at the time she was working full time and had three children who needed her. Marie persisted and at some point Veronique felt it was God calling her to do it and said yes and began teaching Junior High School children. This is now her 11th year of teaching both the adults and children and sharing what she has learned to help others on their faith journey because she was so blessed with hers.
