These reflect three promises: God's promise to bring salvation to all people, Jesus' promise to be with those who follow Him, and Jesus' further promise to return at the end of time. It is not enough simply to admire Jesus and be impressed by what He says. We are asked to take the extra step and follow the way of discipleship. We do not know where the path of discipleship will lead, or when Christ himself will return. In the meantime we are the gatekeepers, the stewards, and the ones left in charge. Our responsibility is to stay alert and focused, even when others seem to be asleep or distracted, so that we are ready to welcome Christ into the world when He comes again. We are also asked to be attentive to the coming of God in our lives today; in the sacrament of Christ's body; in the unlikely guise of the homeless, the hungry, the prisoner, the addict, in whom Christ appears before us; and in the Spirit who is within us. We are urged to live with hope in our hearts for Christ's final return.

## **Parish Registration**

Your parish is your spiritual home. We invite you to register with St. Henry Parish. If you are not sure whether or not you are already registered, call Nancy at the rectory office – 201-436-0857, Ext. 110. However, if you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not registered. Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

A minimum of 3 months membership with St. Henry Parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

How to Report Abuse The Archdiocese takes very seriously any and all allegations of misconduct by members of the clergy, Religious and lay staff of the Archdiocese. We encourage anyone with knowledge of an act of misconduct to inform us immediately so that we may take appropriate action to protect others and provide support to victims of sexual abuse and other misconduct. Individuals who wish to report an allegation of sexual misconduct may do so by calling Karen Clark, Director of the Department for the Protection of the Faithful at 973-497-4254. Victims in need of assistance should call the Archdiocesan Assistance Coordinator at 201-407-3256. They are also encouraged to call the Attorney General of NJ Clergy Abuse Hotline at 855-363-6548.

### OTHER HAPPENINGS - In and Around Bayonne & the Archdiocese of Newark

Please be aware of an increase in scam texts or emails asking parishioners for gift cards or cash, especially during the holiday season. Scammers may pose as a pastor sending a message from an unknown email address, phone number, or social media account asking for money or gift cards, and at times, indicating it is an emergency. Scammers may start by expressing interest to connect via phone or direct message.

Archdiocesan clergy will never contact parish community members in this manner. Furthermore, law enforcement agencies urge all to question any message they receive from someone outside their contacts. If a pastor's name is used, parishioners should contact the parish to verify the legitimacy of the appeal. Anyone who feels they have been the victim of this type of scam is urged to contact their local police department. Individuals also may report fraud or scams via the Federal Trade Commission's fraud reporting website.

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR OUR PARISH COMMUNITY Dear Parish Community: The Archdiocese of Newark has been notified that an individual named (Horacio) Daniel Medina has been falsely presenting himself as a Catholic priest in the northern New Jersey area where he is celebrating Mass in people's homes and then ministering confessions and blessing homes and religious articles. Mr. Medina was permanently removed from the clerical state by the Holy Father in 2013. As a result of the laicization, he is forbidden from wearing clerical dress and from functioning in any capacity as a priest. He is not authorized to celebrate the sacraments, including the Eucharist, or engage in any priestly ministry. Prior to his laicization, Mr. Medina was arrested and charged with child abuse. His name appears on the Archdiocese of Newark's list of credibly accused priests. We urge both clergy and the faithful to refrain from participating in any further attempt by Mr. Medina to offer the Mass or administer other sacraments. We strongly encourage that any such activity be reported immediately to the Archdiocese of Newark at 973-497-4254. We ask that all the faithful join in prayer that Christ may bring healing and hope to anyone who has been abused by a priest or by anyone in the Catholic Church. Any person who wishes to report an incident of abuse or misconduct committed by a member of the Archdiocese of Newark is urged to immediately inform their County Prosecutor or other law enforcement office as well as the Archdiocese's Department for the Protection of the Faithful, For more information, visit online at www.rcan.org.
