Keep in mind that a person is not automatically a registered member because they were married here, or received other sacraments here.

Remember that membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation. Parents who wish to have their child baptized at St. Henry's must be members of the parish.

Religious Education

On Sunday, December 11th I visited all three Confirmation and special needs classes remotely. It was a joy and spiritual enlightenment to be in attendance with God's children.

Our special needs class, led by Amy Vieira, was outstanding both spiritually and lovingly. The children recited all of their prayers. They prayed for those in need and for their family members; they watched videos on the birth of Christ.

All three Confirmation classes are in sync, discussing the Sacrament of Confirmation, the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit, sponsor selection and Confirmation name. The dates for the retreat, Confirmation practice and Confirmation were reviewed. I must compliment all of the catechists for performing an outstanding job of teaching and engaging our candidates. They are: Christine Sorrentino, Isabella DeMoya and Jes Becker. The parish of St. Henry and I are blessed and thankful for the most knowledgeable, spiritual, faith-filled catechists, who continue to give of their time, talent and treasure.

I also joined our RCIA team for our weekly class. We have shared so much information in the past few months. We have covered Prayer, the Liturgical Calendar, beginning the Season of Advent, the Immaculate Conception, the Ten Commandments, Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist, Confirmation, the Christmas Season, the Baptism of the Lord and so much more. We have viewed videos pertaining to this subject matter and engaged in conversation. The RCIA team is extremely knowledgeable about their faith. Thank you to Nancy Kopacz who has done an excellent job of researching and sharing videos with the class; to Veronica Pinto who presented the Ten Commandments to our class and to Ericka Rodas who will facilitate the next class scheduled for January 8th.

We meet 12PM to 1:30 PM usually the first and second Sunday of each month, although we maintain a flexibility to change class dates if necessary. The RCIA program consists of 1 catechumen and 3 candidates this year and is a joyful, spiritual experience for everyone.

Once again, thank you to all who make our parish and Religious Education Program the Light of Christ.
