SYNOD Listening Session

In May, 2021, Pope Francis announced that the 2023 Synod of Bishops will be preceded by a synodal process that includes “listening to all of the baptized” in every diocese.

“Listening to all the baptized” takes place during Listening Sessions where the faithful are invited to offer opinions to specific questions provided by the Holy Father. He is interested in gathering ideas about what is expected of today’s Church. Never in the history of the Church have the laity been asked to provide input as to the future of the Church; you are invited to come and share your ideas. Once all the listening sessions have been completed at the diocesan level, summary reports will be sent to the USCCB where the American bishops will provide a summary document to the Vatican. The Session will be held on Monday, February 21st, from 7:00 – 9:30 PM in the cafeteria of All Saints Catholic Academy.
