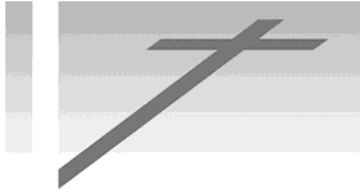

We are called to be as compassionate and generous as Jesus in helping our sisters and brothers in need. We can never match Jesus with the amount, but we can with our motive.

How easy it is to drift away from thinking like Jesus. We begin to cave in to the cynicism bred by our culture of selfishness. To be callous, for example, toward the poor is the first step to perennial stinginess. To be critical of an alcoholic or any other type of addict is to take a giant step toward cold indifference. To be judgmental of another family member not only leads toward disunity, but also to that dysfunction we hear so much about these days. All of it distances us from God. None of it allows us to receive Holy Communion with the right disposition. But there is recovery possible from all of this. There is hope for all of us, and that is true Good News.

In one seat of the bus, a wispy old man sat holding a bunch of fresh flowers. Across the aisle was a young girl whose eyes came back again and again to the man's flowers. The time came for the old man to get off. Impulsively he thrust the flowers into the girl's lap. "I can see that you love the flowers," he explained, "and I think my wife would like you to have them. I'll tell her I gave them to you." The girl accepted the flowers, then watched the old man get off the bus and walk through the gate of a small cemetery.

### Parish Registration

If you are not receiving offering envelopes or various parish mailings, chances are you are not a registered member of St. Henry Parish.

You are not automatically a registered member because you were married here, were brought up here or went to school here. Membership is by formal registration only. To register, come to the rectory office, between 9 AM and 4 PM weekdays and complete a registration card.

Remember, membership with your parish is a requirement if you wish to be a godparent or a sponsor for Confirmation.
